## **Welcome and Introductions**

MRC Co-Vice Chair Brienne Townsend opened the Marine Resources Committee (MRC) meeting at 4:30PM.

Brie introduced herself and asked for self-introductions from the meeting participants. After introductions, Julie Schlenger read the Snohomish County Tribal Acknowledgement.

*“We acknowledge the original inhabitants of this place, the Sah ku mehu (Sauk-Suiattle Tribe), the stuləgʷábs̓ (Stillaguamish Tribe), and the sduhubš̓ (Snohomish) Skykomish, Snoqualmie and their successors the Tulalip Tribes. Since time immemorial, they have hunted, fished, gathered on, and taken care of these lands and waters. We respect their sovereignty, their right to self-determination and honor their sacred spiritual connection with the land and water. We will strive to be honest about our past mistakes and bring about a future that includes their people, stories, and voices to form a more just and equitable society.*

*With this tribal acknowledgement, we open our time together by honoring the ancestors whose feet first knew these lands, and whose paddles still know the waters of what we now call Snohomish County.”*

## **Annual Report Discussion – Natalie Sacker and Vivian Ericson, MFA Consulting**

In collaboration with the Snohomish Marine Resources Advisory Committee (MRC), Maul Foster & Alongi, Inc. (MFA) will assist in the development of the 2025 Annual Report. This year, the Annual Report will continue to be made collaboratively on Canva, and MFA will assist in the creation of the Annual Report.

Natalie led the MRC through a presentation on why the annual reports are created, who the MRC's audience is, and how the MRC will work together with MFA to create the report. Natalie presented on the template and Canva format that the MRC would be using and how MFA will be supporting this effort. Additionally, Natalie did a quick run-through of how to edit the Annual Report Canva document. The MRC is expected to work within its subcommittees to create the first draft of their sections by February 13<sup>th</sup>. There will then be a round of review, and the MRC Subcommittee edits will be due February 25<sup>th</sup>. After this, MFA will adjust any small edits and give the members back a final version for feedback due March 4<sup>th</sup>. At the March 18<sup>th</sup> MRC meeting, the MRC will vote to approve the final so that the final annual report will be ready by March 31<sup>st</sup>.
